The MDE Literacy Coach has done extensive work with K-3 teachers to provide PLCs, model, provide resources, and co-teach with them. To date, only Kindergarten MKAS data is available. The average scale score grew from 476 at the beginning of the year to 663 at the end of the year (+187 points). There were only 2 students (3.4%) scoring at the Transitional Level and 0 at the Probable Reader Level at the beginning of the year. At the end of the year 32 (55.1%) scored Transitional or Probable with a scale score of 681 or higher.
