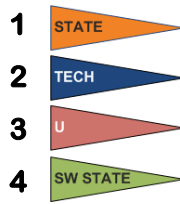

**Disqualified:** This applicant has been disqualified for a scholarship due to disqualifying reported applicant information, or because a waiver has been denied.

**Ineligible:** This applicant is not eligible for a scholarship due to insufficient reported applicant information, or because scores (ACT or SAT, and GPA) do not meet minimum requirements or sufficient documentation has not been received and/or validated by Cadet Command Headquarters to allow the application process to continue. The applicant is eligible if: (1) the SAT total for math and reading is a minimum score of 920; (2) ACT composite score is a minimum of 19; and (3) the end of high school junior year cumulative unweighted GPA is a minimum of 2.5. NOTE: Either SAT or ACT is required, having both is optimal.

**Eligible:** This applicant's SAT/ACT scores and GPA have been validated by Cadet Command Headquarters, based on applicant-provided documentation, and the applicant meets all eligibility standards.

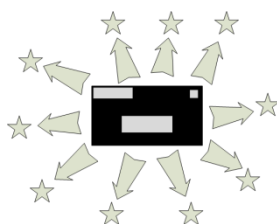
**Interviewee:** An applicant in Interviewee Status may now schedule a face-to-face interview with a current Professor of Military Science (PMS). PMS name and contact information can be found as a Message on the application dashboard. It is the applicant's responsibility to schedule and conduct this interview.

**Board Ready:** This applicant, previously in Interviewee Status, has completed the PMS interview AND completed the Physical Fitness Assessment. An interviewee must complete all application requirements not later than February 28th to be boarded. The application file will be reviewed by a board of PMSs at the next scheduled board.

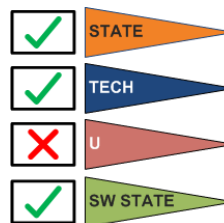
**Boarded:** This applicant's packet has been reviewed by a board of PMSs. An applicant's file will only be boarded once. After boarding, each applicant's file is scored and placed on an Order of Merit List (OML) in numerical order from which winners will be selected.

**Winner:** This applicant has been selected to receive an offer of a 4-year or 3-year Advanced Degreeless Scholarship to up to a schools from the list of schools identified by the applicant in their application. The schools are selected from the applicant's list based on availability of scholarships at that school at the time of the offer. If an applicant wishes to change schools, they must formally request the change by following the guidelines provided with their winner letter.

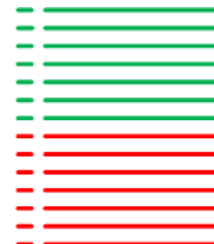

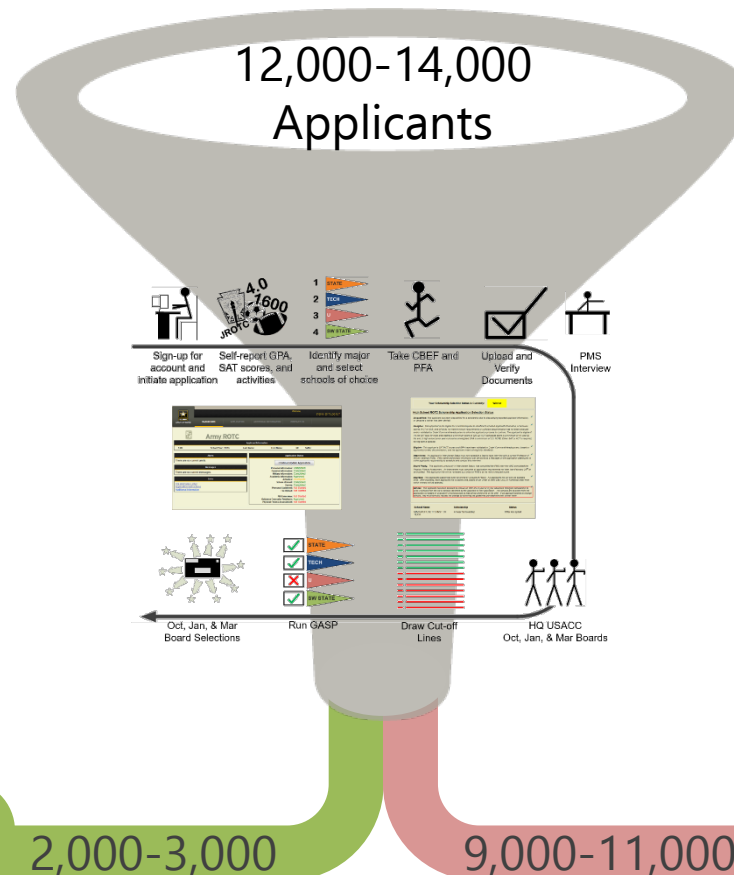

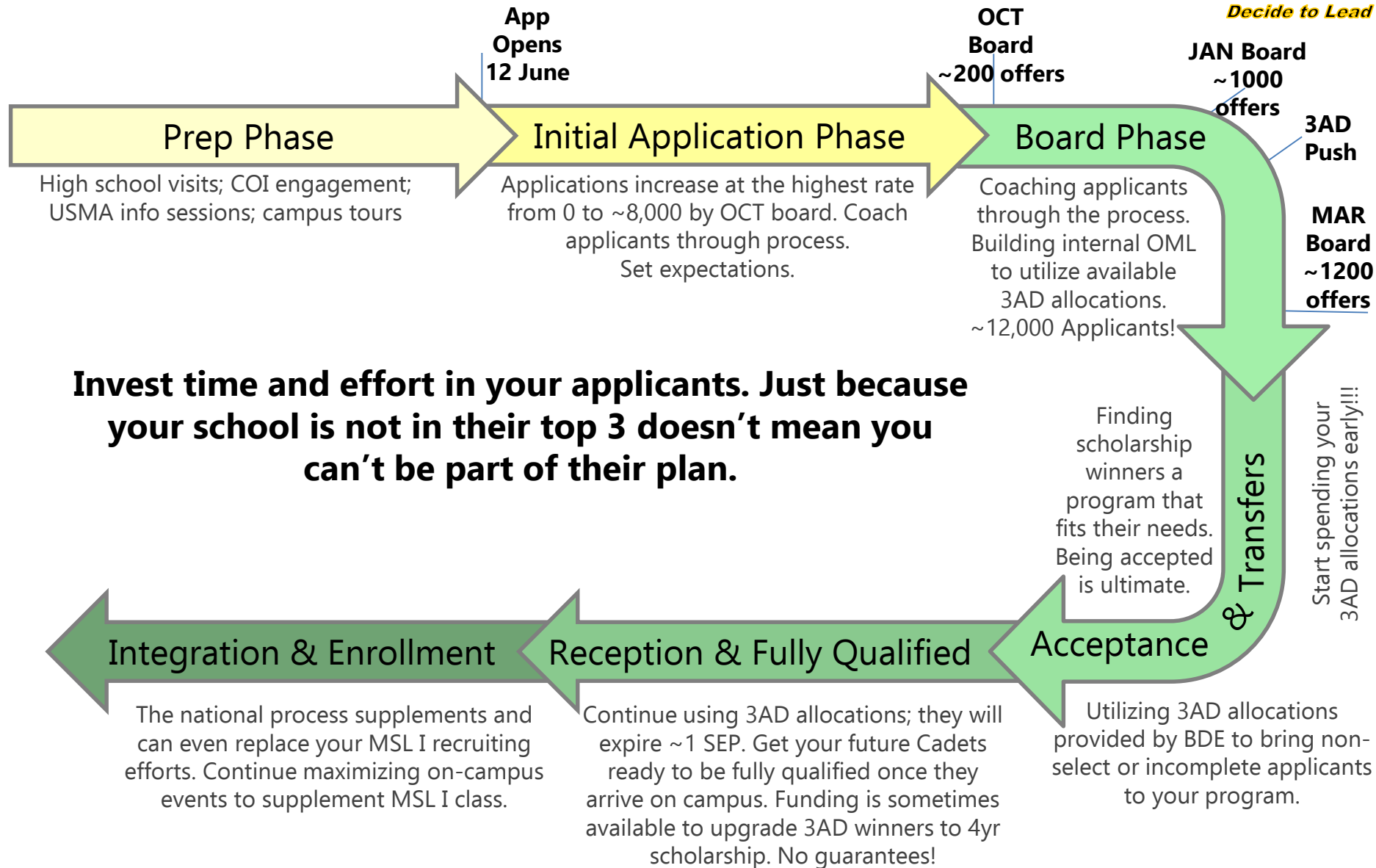

How do you maximize your interview opportunity?

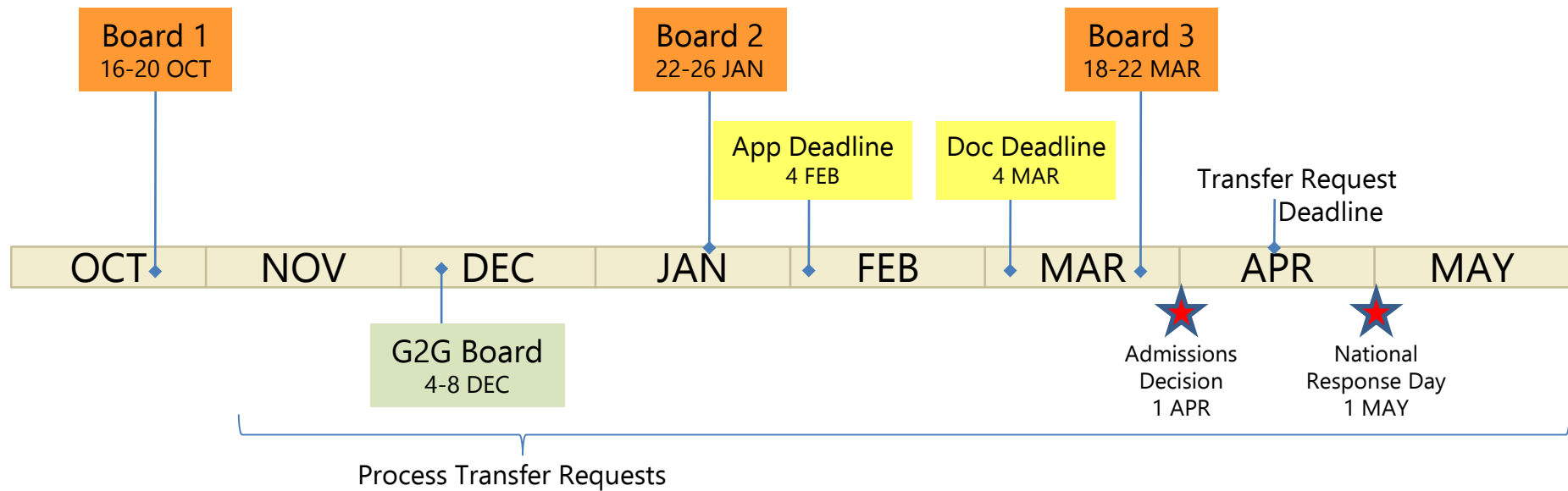

- Regular Decision: 1 & 15 JAN. Admission decisions usually March to April.



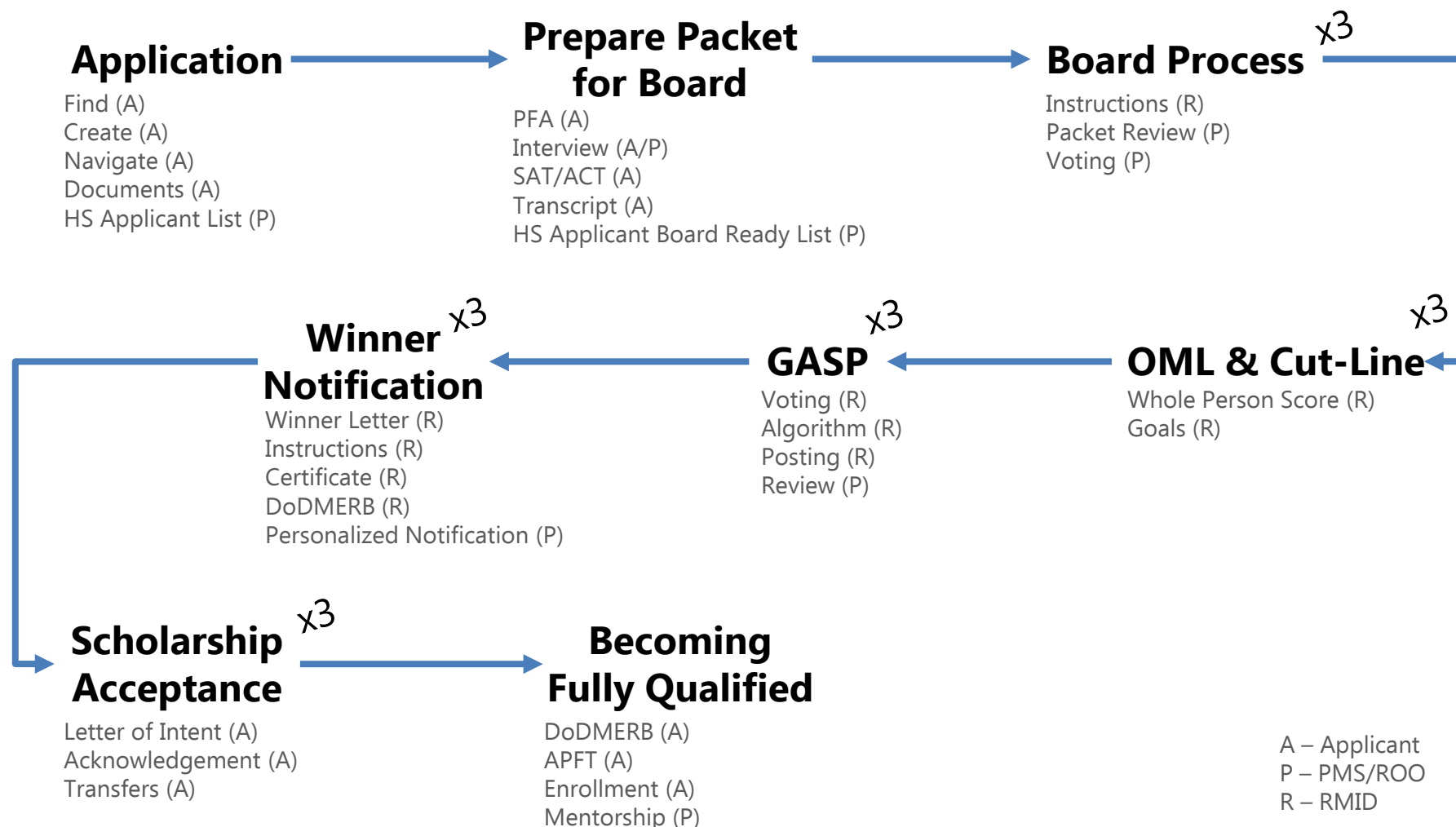

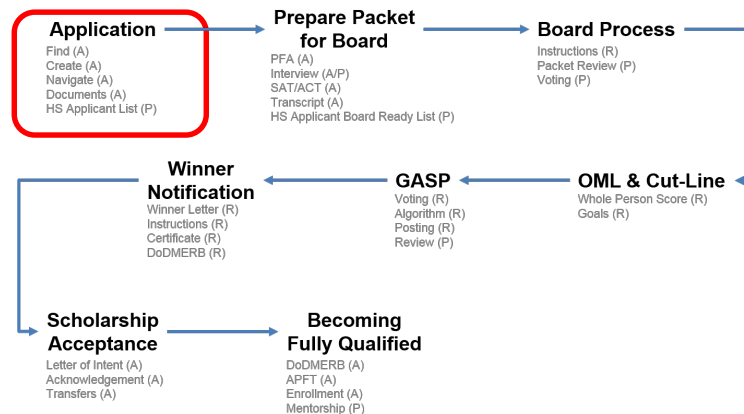

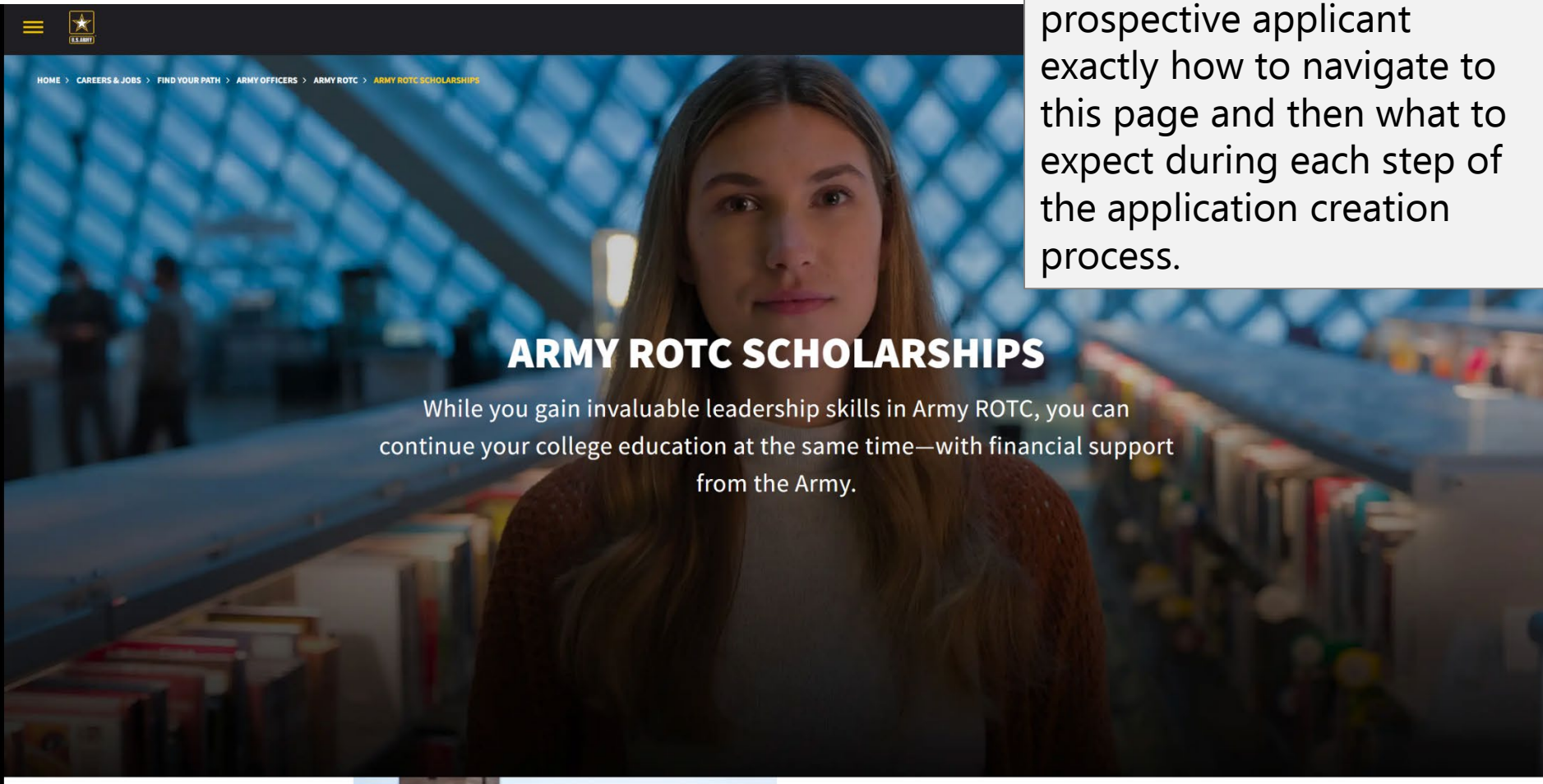

# APPLY WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL

After you complete your junior year of high school, you can get a head start on your future by applying for the ROTC National Scholarship (a four-year scholarship), at a [participating school](#).

## YOUR OBLIGATION

Your acceptance of the scholarship means a future service obligation of:

- Eight years of Army service, with requirements for active duty in the Army, and/or serving in the Army Reserve or Army National Guard, depending on the scholarship
- You may be eligible to serve part time in the Army Reserve or Army National Guard while pursuing a civilian career immediately after graduation

## IMPORTANT DATES

Applications opened on June 12, 2022. Your application must be started no later than Feb. 4, 2023 to be eligible for review by the Army ROTC National Scholarship Board. Here are the application and board review dates for the 2022-2023 school year:

- **Applications are due by Oct. 7, 2022** to be reviewed by the board from Oct. 17-21, 2022
- **Applications are due by Jan. 13, 2023** to be reviewed by the board from Jan. 23-27, 2023
- **Applications are due by Mar. 6, 2023** to be reviewed by the board from Mar. 13-17, 2023

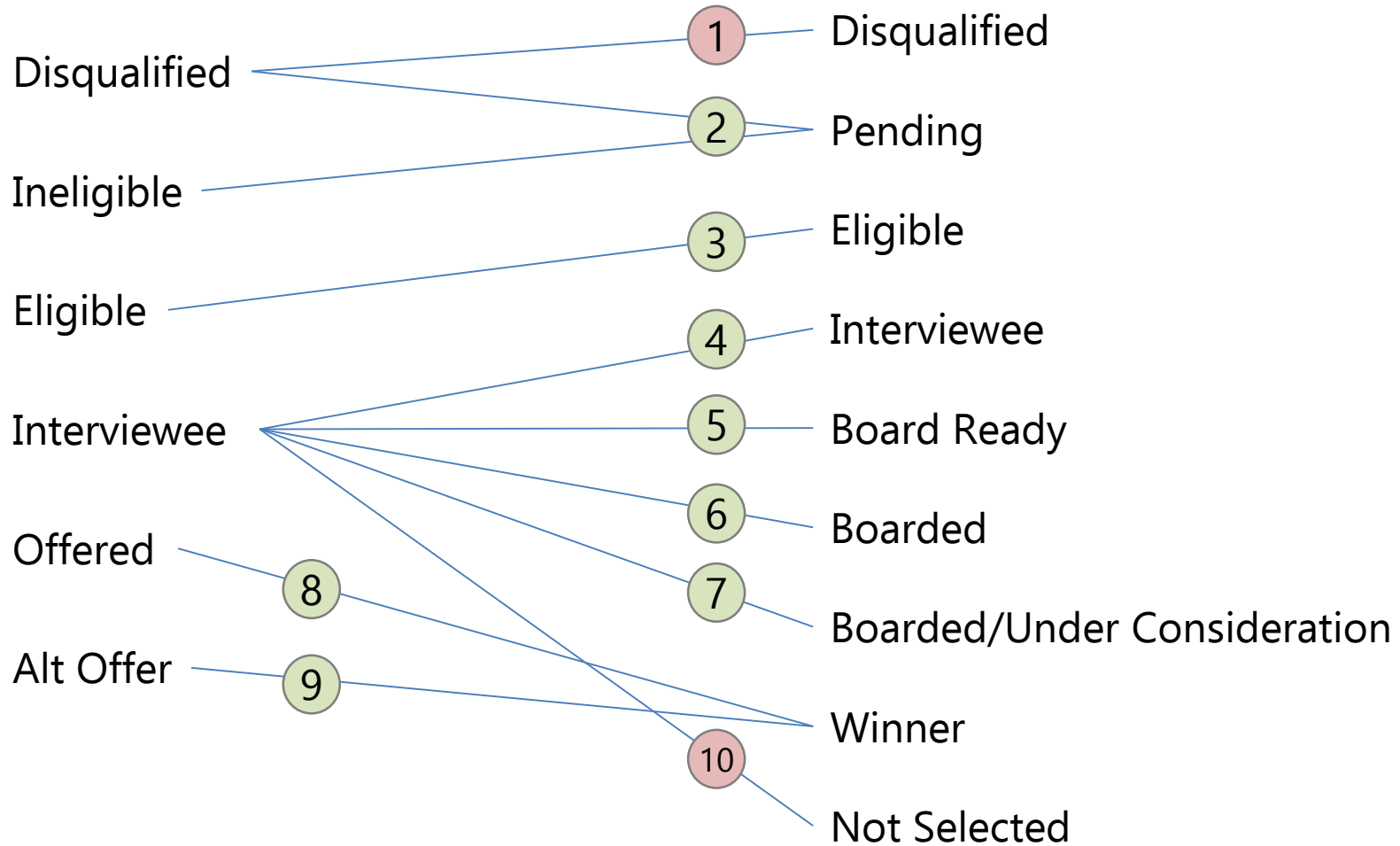

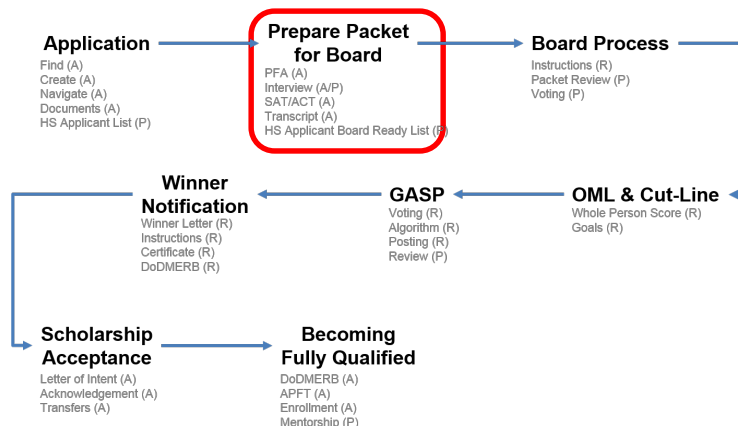

High school transcript is required to verify eligibility using the un-weighted GPA of at least 2.5 through the end of the 11<sup>th</sup>/Junior year – why the application opens 12 JUN. The applicant can input a guidance counselor's name and email address and a link will be send to them to verify academic achievement. (GPA, class rank, etc.)

  - SAT: 1000 (2 test Evidence Based Reading & Writing and Math)
  - ACT: 19 (composite score)
- Super Scoring. Like many colleges, Cadet Command “super scores” your multiple tests and uses the best possible score.

- This test is designed to be administered by a representative from the applicant's school or a coach.
- Be aware if you try to administer the PFA during the applicant interview or any other time while on your campus – they are not a student at your school. Understand what your host university's policies are and ensure you are in compliance.

The applicant must input a coach, gym teacher or JROTC instructor's name and email address and a link will be sent to that person to electronically enter the applicant's PFA scores. 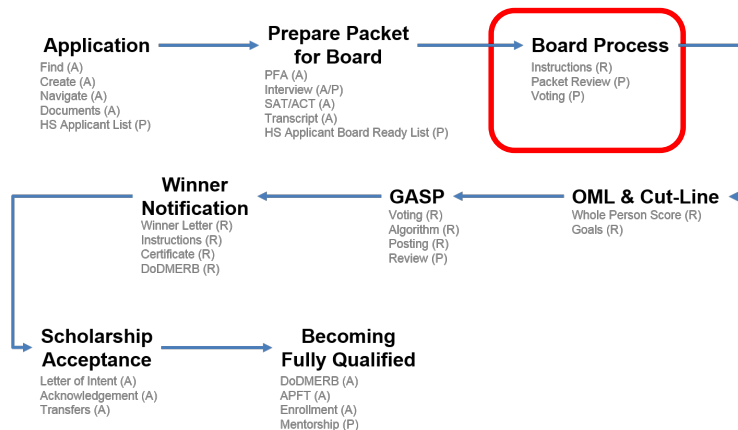


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- To provide the selection board with an “eyes on” observation and evaluation of the applicant’s composure, appearance, verbal communication skills, motivation, and overall potential.
- To provide information to the applicant on the Army ROTC Program.
- To assess the qualitative aspects of an applicant as a potential scholarship winner.
- To get an impression of the willingness to complete the Army ROTC Program and serve as an officer in the Army.

Treat the Interview as a recruiting event.

# Board Process



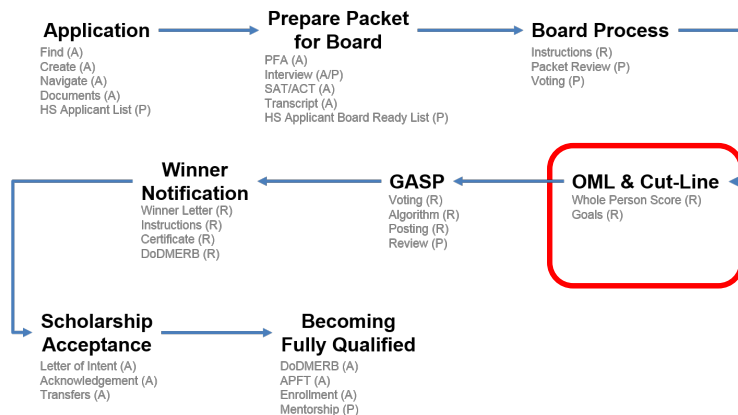
- Conducted three times each year (OCT, JAN, MAR) before each round of winner notifications.
- Each “Board Ready” applicant is reviewed and voted by three different, experienced PMSs.
- Once the board starts, the applicant’s selection status will stay “Board Ready” until all three PMSs have voted when they will turn to “Boarded” status.
- Decisions and notifications usually take 2-3 weeks following the completion of the board.

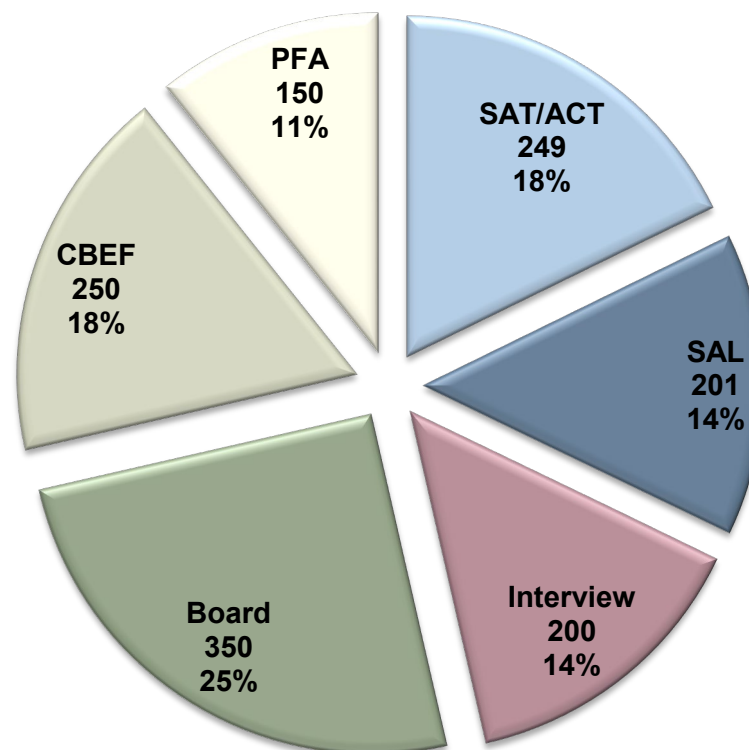

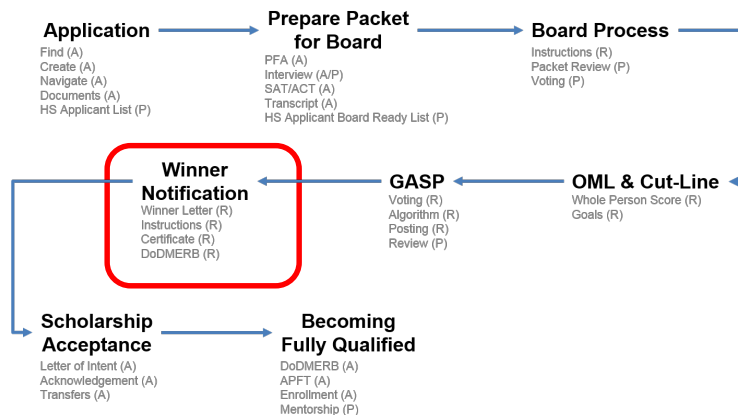

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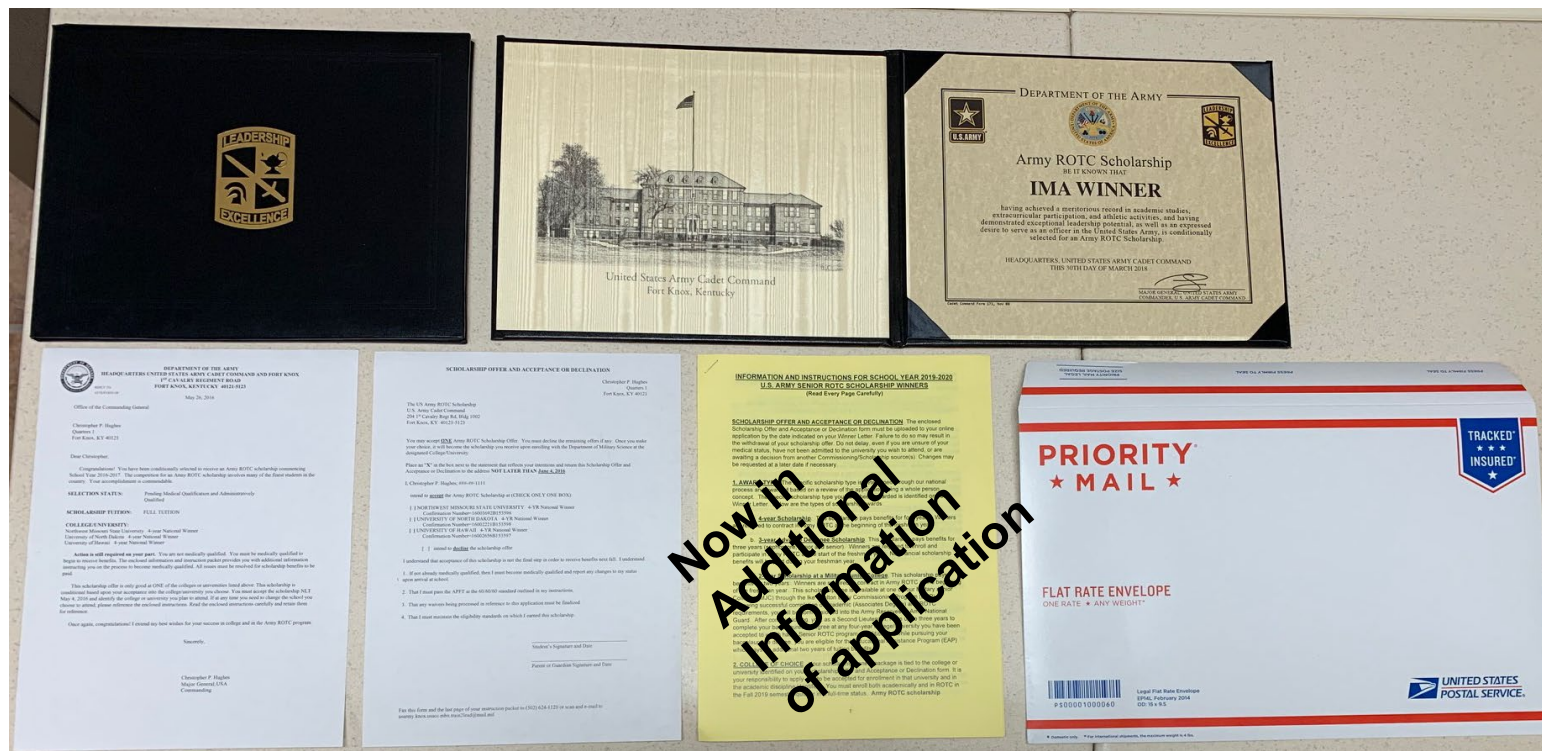
