Fall Learning Experience Survey Overview

Provide district leaders with quick and frequent access to the *current* experiences of *students*, *families*, and *staff* across a school community.

Survey Domain	Description
Wellness	Wellbeing related to health and level of support provided by the district/school
Student Learning	Effectiveness of distance learning including engagement & rigor of student work & instructions
Connectedness & Support	Continued interaction & collaboration between peers & groups of stakeholders
Access	Access to tech, tech support & barriers to distance learning
Communication & Expectations	Effectiveness & frequency of communications between district and stakeholders
Time Allocation	Breakdown of teacher and school leader time spent on various aspects of their roles

80% of students indicated that they can easily participate in their live online classes and turn in completed assignments.


Over 70% of parents or guardians indicated that their child can easily participate in online classes and submit their class assignments.




Learning Vision and Feedback

Student Learning: OTHER TRENDS


48% of teachers reported teaching all or mostly new grade-level content; the remaining <u>52% of teachers</u> were teaching some to little grade-level content this year.

59% of teachers and 46% of school leaders indicated that all students are getting the academic support they need to succeed.

Mental Health Support

Multiple stakeholder groups expressed concerns of adequate mental health support for students and staff from the district.

My district provides adequate mental health support to students and staff.



Next Steps: Progress Monitoring

- Share findings of the survey with stakeholder groups within JPS community
- Implement 3-4 progress monitoring cycles
- Collect data using a shortened Fall Learning Experience Survey
- Use a "tiering" strategy to benchmark and compare results
- Results will be used to support JPS in reviewing and understanding the data findings and identifying priority areas
